

How to Overcome Alcoholism the Easy Way

Raise A Glass to Christ Alone!

- Pray to God thanking him for the bottle of wine or strong drink before you open it, and pray to God before you have a drink and ask him to bless it. And he will.
- Alcohol abuse programs take away people's free will. People sell out to them and think it helps them. But it's really just a man-made program based on control.
- Alcohol abuse programs claim alcoholism is a disease; a sickness. It is not. Getting drunk is a sin, not a disease. Even if it is a disease, as some claim, Jesus Christ heals all sicknesses and diseases and gives New life. (Psalm 103:3, John 10:10)
- The Nazarites and the Rechabites were the only people in the Bible who were made to not drink wine or strong drink. They were rewarded well by God for that free will choice of theirs. (Numbers 6:1-21); (Jeremiah 35)
- Jesus Christ, who is True God, also made water into wine. And not just any wine, but the best wine at the wedding. (John 2:1-11)
- David and his men drank wine in the wilderness to keep them strengthened and lively. (2 Samuel 16:1,2)
- You are also not to approach God's altar on steps (Exodus 20:25,26). And man-made alcohol abuse programs give you plenty of steps to work through your alcoholism. But why work through it when you can just receive freedom from the Lord and be free and overcome? The gift is free from God. Work not required. It's a healing. It doesn't mean you stop drinking entirely, it means you use the self-control God has already given you to rule over your body and what you put into it.
- Alcohol abuse programs teach that you must not drink at all. Why is that? When has prohibition of alcohol ever worked anywhere?
- Realistically, most human bodies are meant to take alcohol sometimes.
- They teach that you are powerless over a substance, alcohol. But that is not true if you are a Christian. Jesus Christ gives self-control as a fruit of the Holy Spirit, and he also gives free will. (Galatians 5:22-25)
- There is a physical need for the feeling that alcohol gives. There's nothing wrong with that, except that it feels awful to go without it when you need it. So drink. Do drink, just call on God first. Pray over the shot; pray over the glass of wine, and give thanks to God and acknowledge him when you drink. (Psalm 104:14-15)
- And don't drive after you drink. (Common Sense 1:1)
- Jesus grants us a New life in which we overcome. (John 16:33; Revelation 2:7, 2:11, 2:17, 2:26, 3:5, 3:12 and 3:21) And if prayed for and asked for he will, by the Holy Spirit give a person the ability to control their own drinking by their own free will, not by the will of the bottle nor by the will of the man-made alcohol abuse program.
- Recovery does not last forever. It ends and one is recovered. Victory is in Christ. (1 Corinthians 15:57)
- You may have your wine or liquor and drink it, too! (Ecclesiastes 9:7)
- Never raise a glass again to anyone except Jesus Christ who gives you the freedom and self-control. You win!

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The New Twelve Steps

- Step 1. We claim victory in the name of Jesus Christ over our sin - that our lives are now become manageable.
- Step 2. Have come to believe that God, who, in us, is greater than ourselves and the world, restores us to sanity.
- Step 3. Make a decision to turn our will and our lives over to the care of God as He is.
- Step 4. Seek the Lord fearlessly, boldly coming before the throne of grace and presenting a moral inventory of ourselves to Him.
- Step 5. Admit to God, to ourselves, and to Jesus Christ the exact nature of our sins and sinfulness.
- Step 6. Are always entirely ready to have God blot out all these sins and cast them as far as the east is from the west.
- Step 7. Humbly seek the Lord that He would remove our sin.
- Step 8. Make a list of all persons we know and love, and become willing to bless them in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ.
- Step 9. Make direct blessings to such people wherever and whenever possible, including when to do so would bless others.
- Step 10. Daily present ourselves to the Lord to let Him make us right.
- Step 11. Seek through prayer and meditation to improve our relationship with God, as He is, praying for His Kingdom to come and His will to be done on Earth as it is in Heaven.
- Step 12. Having tasted the blood of Jesus Christ, we repented of our sin, overcame, and brought this message to other believers.

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
