

# Six Point Prayer

You may give God your prayer requests by answering the **who, what, where, when, why, and how** of your request. You can be detailed or vague, specific or general.

**Who?** - Who should I pray for? Who should receive the blessing? Who does the request pertain to?

**What?** - What is the request? What is the desired blessing? What are you seeking God about in prayer?

**Where?** - Where does the prayer request take place? Where does it pertain to? Where is the physical location of the requested blessing? Where figuratively speaking, is the blessing to be?

**When?** - When would you like the blessing to happen? What is the time period of your prayer? When do you request to receive the said blessing from the Lord? Will you be patient and wait for it?

**Why?** - Why are you making this specific prayer request? Why do you ask for it? Why should God grant your request? Why the need to make the request?

**How?** - How does the blessing take place? How is it to be received? How would you view this prayer as being answered? How would you like God to respond to your prayer?

**Here is an example of a prayer of Jesus from Matthew 6:9-15**

Our Father in heaven,  
hallowed be your name.  
Your kingdom come,  
your will be done,  
on earth as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread,  
and forgive us our debts,  
as we also have forgiven our debtors.

And lead us not into temptation,  
but deliver us from evil.

For if you forgive others their trespasses, your heavenly Father will also forgive you, but if you do not forgive others their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses.

**Who?** "Our Father in heaven,  
hallowed be your name.

**What?** Your kingdom come,  
your will be done,

**Where?** on earth as it is in heaven.

**When?** Give us this day our daily bread,

**How?** and forgive us our debts,  
as we also have forgiven our debtors.

And lead us not into temptation,  
but deliver us from evil.
